Dear Applicant:

The **Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund** is committed to the growth and development of African America's youth and young adults. The Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund awards scholarships annually to deserving students to further their education. Recipients are selected based on academic achievement, character, school and community involvement. Awards can be used for full-time or part-time study at a technical school, a community college or four-year college. Students need to have applied or been accepted into a school at the time they apply for funding from the **Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund**. Our goal is to provide scholarships or grants to deserving African American high school and college students.

Applicants must meet all of the eligibility requirements and deadlines to qualify. Awards should be applied toward tuition, room & board, books and fees. Checks will be mailed from the **Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund** office and made payable to the education institution or awarded student. Individuals applying for a scholarship or grant must forward a complete application packet. Current scholarship or grant recipients must re-apply each year. Application packets must be postmarked within the application acceptance period. ***Incomplete packets will not be considered and returned to applicant.*** Mail complete application packets to: Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund at 5839 S. For an Application to be considered complete, you must include the following:

- Completed application form (Applicants under 18 years old, make sure both you and your parent/guardian sign the application form)
- Answer all of the short essay questions on a separate sheet of paper within the recommended work limit.
- Provide transcript(s) of all completed high school and college coursework.
- Confirmation of Community Service (Options for Grants).
- Recommendation Letters.

Sedgwick Haynes Memorial Calf Roping Fee Grant

One **BPIR Calf Roping Contestant** will be selected to receive a grant to cover calf roping fees only for a year. The Fee Grants will be awarded in the memory of **Sedgwick Haynes** in January of each year. The BPMSF will award a Fee Grant annually to a Calf Roping contestant from the BPIR Association. *All application must be submitted no later than November 30th of each year for consideration.*

Eligibility

Contestants who meet ALL of the following criteria are encouraged to apply:

- Must be between the ages 6 and 24.
- Enrolled in school or a higher education institution.
- Must be a member of BPIR Association in good standing.

Selection: This program aims to support engaged contestants who have a long-term interest in Calf Roping.

- The annual allocation will be \$750 to cover entry fees.
- The first Fee Grant will be awarded in January of 2019.

The funds are held in trust by the **Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund** and distributed at each rodeo during the year.

Award: All fees are paid (either):

- Directly to BPIR to cover fees.
- Reimbursed to contestant within one week after performance, if fees were paid by contestant.
- All funds must be used in the year awarded.
